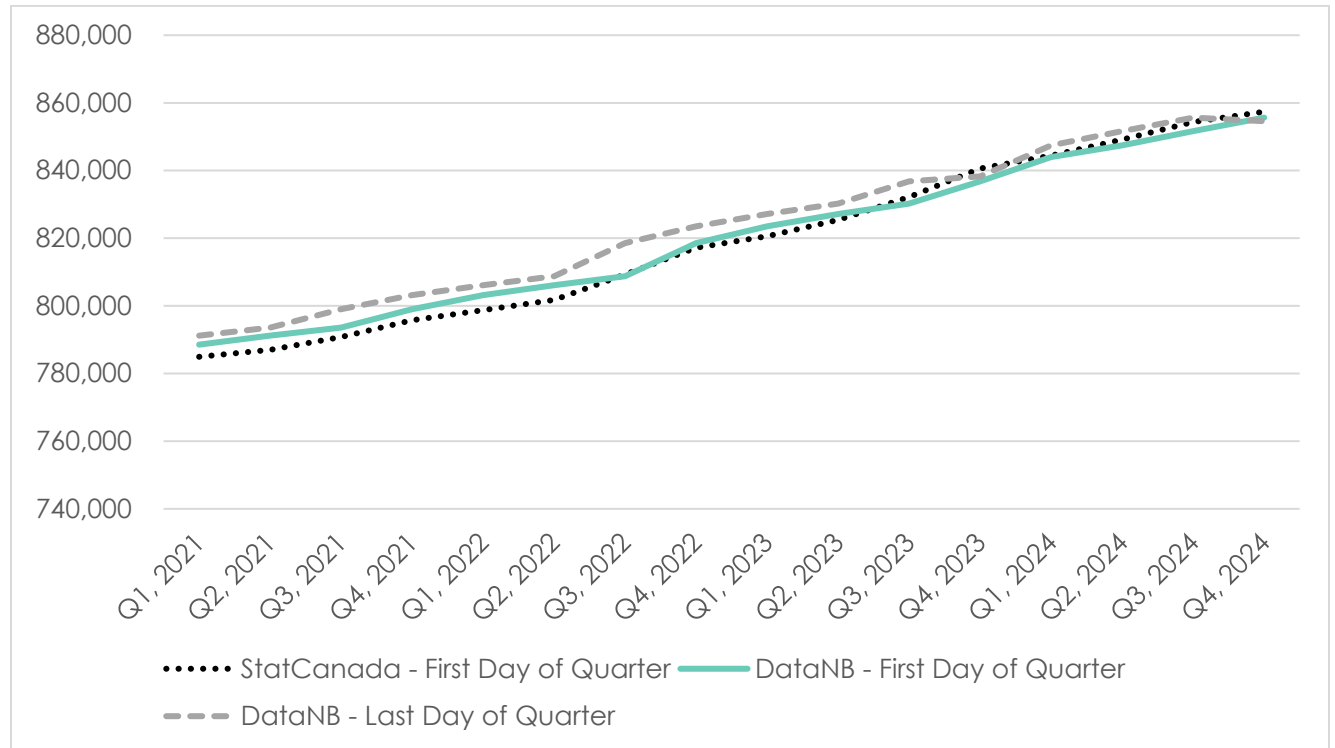

It is important to note that each year's counts in Table 1 are based on immigration status as of that year. When an individual's status changes, it is updated in the Citizen Data. Because the "Immigration Status" indicator in the Citizen Data is not longitudinal (that is – it only presents one observation per individual), an individual's previous immigration status (i.e., Permanent Resident) is overwritten by the new status (i.e., Citizen). The notable change in the composition of immigration statuses presented above is partly due to these status updates in the Citizen Data.
